Traditional nanosecond lasers rely predominantly on photothermal action, in which heat is delivered to the pigment and the surrounding tissue. PicoSure's ultra-short pulse, in contrast, creates an intense photomechanical effect. It shatters the target ink into tiny particles that are more easily eliminated by the body. This results in better removal without injury to the skin.

> The PicoSure® procedure can be used on anyone who wishes to remove a tattoo on any part of the body, or who has benign pigmented lesions as a result of tattoos. According to information from the American Society for Aesthetic Plastic Surgery (ASAPS), tattoo removal has increased in all age groups, and even baby boomers in the sixty-and-up set are getting in on the tattoo removal action. The number of treatments required depends, of course, on the number of tattoos, the colors of the ink, the age of the tattoos, and complete removal can take
